## The Problem

- Copyright framework grants exclusive rights to authors to copy their works, make them available to the public and make derivative works (such as language corpora).
- In the EU databases are protected against unauthorized extraction and re-utilization of their contents.

### The Solution

- Any distribution of data or software must include explicit licenses
- Authors must assign the license to their work

#### Problem<sup>2</sup>

- Authors are not legal experts
- Law is scary
- License texts are long and complicated
- Result: Authors avoid this in 3 ways (all bad):
  - 1. Not distributing their works
  - 2. Distributing without license
  - 3. Using whatever random license they have heard about

#### Solution<sup>2</sup>

- A tool to help authors to choose a license that makes sense:
  - E.g. data/software difference
  - Respecting the limitations of data
  - As free as possible

## Public License

- Grants certain rights not to one particular user, but to the general public (everybody)
- (too) Many choices:
  - 78 OpenSource licenses (OSI approved) for software
  - Creative commons, Open Data Commons, and more for data

#### Creative Commons Attribution (CC-BY)

This is the standard creative commons license that gives others maximum freedom to do what they want with your work.

#### Creative Commons Attribution-NoDerivs (CC-BY-ND)

The no derivatives creative commons license is straightforward; you can take a work released under this license and re-distribute it but you cannot change it.
